Village Treatment Plant, Community Drive, Tully, NY

The CLEAN-UP DAY is ONLY for Village of Tully and Town of Tully residents. You must show proof of residency and accompany vehicle at drop-off site. Proof of residency must have your street address on it.

A Post Office Box will not be accepted as proof of residency.

NO PROOF OF RESIDENCY - NO DUMPING

All items must be less than 10 feet in length. All oil, gas and antifreeze products, which are not acceptable for disposal, must be drained from tanks and equipment.

IF YOU HAVE UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS ON BOARD, YOU WILL NOT BE ALLOWED ON SITE

WILL ACCEPT:

Most General Rubbish, Appliances, Metal, Computers (Flat Screens Only), Electronics, Lawn & Garden Waste, Vehicle Batteries, Empty Drums and Pails cut in half.

Tires will be accepted off the rim at a cost—(Prices subject to change) Please have the correct amount of money.

16-inch and smaller tires: \$3.00 17-inch and larger-truck tires: \$7.00

Large tires: \$25.00

WILL NOT ACCEPT: Rechargeable or disposable household batteries, Fluorescent tubes, Brush, Garbage, **TELEVISIONS**, Recyclables, Pails with lids, Whole drums, Paints, Chemicals, Oil, Gas, Antifreeze or any Hazardous Waste

Please separate items to improve efficiency at disposal site.

DROP OFF STATION 1 – Tires, vehicle batteries, empty propane tanks, computer monitors, keyboards, microwaves and major electronic components

DROP OFF STATION 2 - General rubbish

DROP OFF STATION 3 – All metals & appliances except refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, dehumidifiers and humidifiers

DROP OFF STATION 4 – Refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, dehumidifiers, humidifiers, box springs & mattresses


DROP OFF STATION 5 - Lawn & garden waste

Our Tully Parks

Tracy Lake and South Meadows Nature Area suffered from the early summer wet season. We are happy to report that Tracy Lake property, under the Stewardship of Peter Huntington, has now dried to walkable condition and a few fallen trees have been removed.

However, South Meadows Nature Area, under the stewardship of Marian Jerose, had far more water damage with fallen trees, boardwalks thrown about and the bridge over the entrance creek was tossed far off its moorings. Marian's work crew constructed a higher gravel footing for the bridge and moved it back to the original location with jacks and levers. Also a number of heavy plank board walks, which travel over wet lands, were maneuvered back into place. The unique capability for manually lifting these heavy pieces was engineer

ed

by Volunteer Bob Wiley. Also several fallen trees had to be removed. TAG is happy to report that our two diamond CNYLT properties are now fit for foot traffic and once again back to healthy conditions.
