# Town and Village of Tully Hosting Community Open House and Facilitating Community Survey for Joint Comprehensive Plan Update

Tully, NY – The Town and Village of Tully invite all residents and community stakeholders to attend a Community Open House and complete a Community Survey for the Joint Comprehensive Plan Update. The Community Open House event will take place at the Tully Municipal Building (5833 Meetinghouse Rd, Tully, NY 13159) on Thursday, March 30th from 6:00 PM to 8:00 PM. A comprehensive plan is one of a community's most important documents. It explores the community's existing conditions; establishes a vision, goals, objectives, and action items to be pursued over the near- and long-term; maps and describes desired future land use types; and provides a strategy for implementation. Overall, the comprehensive plan serves as a guide for decision-makers in both the public and private realm by identifying the community's desired future state and the types of projects and programs that the community would likely support.

Since the Town and Village's current Joint Comprehensive Plan was adopted in 2005, changing conditions and trends have resulted in the need for an Update to ensure that the intent of the Joint Comprehensive Plan is in line with the current and future needs of the Town and Village. Therefore, the Town and Village hired a team of community planning professionals from Barton & Loguidice to facilitate the Update process. Ultimately, the intent of the Update is to develop a user-friendly Joint Comprehensive Plan that responds to the community's current challenges and opportunities and establishes a framework for achieving the community's future vision.

The Community Open House will begin with a brief presentation providing an overview of the Update purpose and process. Then, the event will break out into a poster gallery through which attendees can learn about the project and provide feedback at their own leisure. The consultant team and members of the Comprehensive Plan Sub-Committee will be available to answer your questions and collect and discuss your feedback.


Free Math and Science tutoring for grades 9-12 is ongoing at the library on Wednesday and Sunday mornings.
