Update from Supervisor 4/12/23

Recently, the Tully Town Board has addressed numerous actions concerning Solar development within our Town. I thought it was appropriate to recap what had been transpiring.

Initially, we had an application for three solar sites within the Town. At that time, we really had no effective regulations governing the placement or construction of these facilities. The Board, therefore, enacted a moratorium on development and worked on a local law regulating the construction, setbacks, "view shed," and the overall life cycle of the project. This also included a "bond for removal" at the end of its life. At this point in time, we understood that these three sites were the "limit" of what could be constructed due to the limitations in our local electrical infrastructure.

Moving on to more recent developments, our infrastructure was enhanced and again we received applications for development. In this recent case, it was for an addendum or enlargement of one of the current sites. At this time, we realized we needed additional regulations to preserve the natural beauty of our community, while being respectful of landowner rights. We again enacted a moratorium and passed a local law creating a "Solar Overlay District." This is a submission, by the developer, setting additional guidelines on siting, size and proximity to existing sites and provides for review and approval of planning board. In this month's board meeting, we approved this site which is basically an extension of the existing site. The logic here is to use up the capacity at a site which already exists, and is mostly out of people's view.

These developments are around what is referred to as "Community infrastructure." This means they are connected to our local electrical substation, hence the limitations on capacity. We have also been contacted by another company about a utility-based site on Sky High Rd. This has been stagnant for some time, and there is no formal submission in place. In the case of utility-based sites, the connection is made directly to the high-tension electrical lines.

It is of utmost importance, to the Board and myself, that our citizens understand that the preservation of Tully's rural nature and natural beauty is an important priority to us. We are working hard to manage this and yet be respectful of landowner rights. Site placement, "view shed," and landscape screening are priorities.

I also want to mention that the State of New York has already acted to remove the ability of local municipalities from regulating larger sites exceeding 20 megawatts.

News from Tully Free Library

Tully Wastewater Treatment and DPW Staff

We now have a fully staffed Department of Public Works consisting of Kevin Kwiatkowski (Wastewater Treatment Operator), Mike Hoke (Labor Crew Leader and Water Treatment Operator), and Scott Haynes (Laborer). Please introduce yourself to them when you see them. They are working hard on spring cleanup, picking up yard waste on Mondays from April to October, before 7 am. Shrub trimmings and small twigs must be bagged, preferably in brown paper, but supposedly biodegradable plastic bags may be used (it takes a LONG time for these to degrade.). Brush can be placed between sidewalk and street with all cut ends pointing in the same direction as traffic, with no roots attached. The resulting wood chips may be picked up for free at the plant.

Problems continue with blockages in the sewer system caused by supposedly flushable wipes. They are NOT flushable, and wind around each other to block the sewer line. In the past month our DPW has had to spend thousands in extra time and equipment in order to unblock the sanitary sewers **PAID FOR BY YOUR TAX DOLLARS!** Please also be aware that grease should never be flushed into drains or toilets. Grease should be put into a container and then into the garbage.

Comprehensive Plan for Village and Town of Tully

The current progress for writing the Comprehensive Plan for the Village and Town of Tully was brought before the public at a forum on March 30th by Barton and Loguidice. Posters were provided with options for agreement or disagreement, and new suggestions. The survey posted online and available on paper at locations in the Village (Library, Post Office, Bloomin' Cup, and Town Hall) will be added to the online input for review by the committee. There will be another Community Open House on May 31 from 6-7:30 pm, followed by a public hearing at 7:30 pm. The location is to be determined.

Military Display

Stop by to view our annual Military Display in the sanctuary of the Tully Area Historical Society Building beginning May 20th. There will be over 200 pictures of Tully servicemen and women in uniform along with information pertaining to their branch of service, rank, where served and special honors.
