# Tully's 37th annual Ice Harvest will be held (weather permitting) on Saturday, February 18th - 11:00 a.m.-2:00 p.m. at Green Lake. This event is under the leadership of the New York State Draft Horse Club in conjunction with the Tully Area Historical Society. The Boy Scouts will be serving Hot Beverages and assisting with the ice harvest.

Ice Harvesting was once a main Winter industry in Tully, dating back over 100 years. This was spurred on by the natural formations known as the Tully Kettle Lakes. The Ice Harvesting Industry employed several hundred people in the area, up to the 1930's. There were four ice warehouses in the Village; as well as most farmers had their own Ice House to keep their milk cold until time of shipment. Ice was stored in the warehouses for shipment via rail; as well as door-to-door ice delivery to households in the area. It is recorded that one year 1,000 tons of ice was harvested just from Green Lake. Ice was also harvested in those days from Tully, Song, and Crooked Lakes.

Today, one to two weeks prior to the Ice Harvest festivities, the depth of the ice is tested using an ice auger. Snow is removed, using a scraper three to four days prior to harvest to prevent loss of density in the ice. On the day of our annual event, depth of ice is given a final test and snow removed. The ice is next marked in both directions about 2" deep and scored into 18" squares by using a scoring tool. Using hand saws, the ice is cut to form a channel for removing the ice blocks. The long handled ice saws are then used to cut the ice blocks. A spud bar, ice poles and hooks

are used to guide the squares through the channel to the slide rack; and tongs used to get the ice onto the rack and up to the horse drawn wagon. The ice is then hauled to the Estey Ice House, also located at Green Lake. The ice is used in the churning of the homemade ice cream served by the Tully Area Historical Society at the Elementary Band Concert held in June.

## in Memory of Lynn M. Fisher

Lynn M. Fisher passed away on December 22nd at the age of 72. Lynn was Town Historian for the Town of Tully for over 20 years. She was a 1966 graduate of Syracuse University and obtained a Master's Degree in Library Science from SU in 1972.

While Town Historian, her emphasis was on education, giving walking tours of the Village

and collecting oral histories from many residents, which are now archived at the Tully Area Historical Society. She was an active member of the Association of Public Historians of New York State (APHNYS). Lynn was also Executive Director of the Tully Area Historical Society in the late 1980's. Lynn will be remembered for her loyal dedication to our community.

A memorial service is planned to be held in Tully this spring.


