# Fire

They are also looking at some demos which could possibly save the department and the taxpayers somewhere between seventy to one hundred thousand dollars if purchased. They are also looking at several vendors that are on the state contract that would be a possibility. There is also a meeting scheduled with Huber Breuer on Monday regarding issues with the building.

Supervisor Lund explained briefly that we had been approached by Wells Fargo and that they would like to donate a piece of property on Rt. 11 to the Town plus give the Town an additional \$20,000. The town attorney was consulted and it is legal for the town board to approve this kind of donation.

Ms. Hills suggested to the board that they did have the right to waive the side-yard setback as well as the height requirement if they so desired. Melissa Hinman, a representative from CEC Energy, spoke to the board regarding the packet of information that had been sent in with the application. Lengthy discussion followed after which Ms. Hills suggested that the application be tabled at this point.

**Bond Resolution** - Next, Ms. Hills read from the Bond Resolution "authorizing the acquisition and equipping of a snow plow truck and ambulance at an estimated maximum cost of \$320,000, appropriating said amount therefor, and authorizing the issuance of up to \$320,000 bond anticipation notes and serial bonds of the town to pay the cost thereof." There was a brief discussion with questions by board members after which there was the following motion:
