Parks & Recreation

Ryan Dando reported on the following rec activities:

- The Parks & Rec board met and discussed raising the fee for the deposit on the pavilion from \$25 to \$50 and are in favor of that; would like to make it effective next year
- The locks were replaced on the concession stand building; keys were given out and a list of names will be kept by the town clerk
- Green Lake failed water tests; meeting with the County health department to remedy the situation; it's the sinks where the children wash their hands, so the thinking is it's the well and may need a purification system. Discussion followed.

Highway

John Herold reported on the following:

- Had a good month; a few repairs on some of the equipment
- Working on storm repairs from all the rain; estimating about \$40,000 in damage
- Lost Woodmancy Road, the shoulder of the road went down about 14 feet; Murphy Road, same thing happened; Strong Road also; we may get reimbursed from the County
- New stake-rack coming soon
- DEC is shutting down the toad hole on the west side of Rt. 281 so we can't dump in there anymore. Discussion followed.

Ambulance

Bryan reported on ambulance activities:

- EMS calls for June were 47
- The Panasonic Toughbook Computers were received and we're now waiting to receive the docking station for each vehicle.
- Our operating certificate from the New York State Department of Health arrived on July 7, 2017. We have yet to receive our new Controlled Substance license.
- The storm on July 1st caused several motor vehicle crashes on I-81 due to a high water level for which our staff responded.
- I have been contacted by MultiMed Billing Company that they now have legal services regarding No-Fault and Workers Compensation claims; so if they have any problem recovering monies owed us for these claims, the legal firm will work on our behalf to recover those monies.
- Chris Thompson, who was hired as our training coordinator, has submitted her resignation effective July 1, 2017; it's due to family issues. I will be meeting with other County EMS Directors to discuss a possible solution.
- We completed our annual CPR training for the Town lifeguards.
